The dawn of the year 2000 finds our fraternity with many accomplishments to be proud of, and very optimistic about the future. Over the last two years, the chapter house has been improved with new carpet, roof, furnace, landscaping, mortgage and high-speed Internet access. And much to the delight of certain alumni, beautiful new windows will be installed in every room this summer. Also, the Phi Phi Club has an incredible Web site (www.phiphiclub.com), which has allowed alumni to stay in touch with the fraternity and each other on a regular basis.

We have also been increasingly successful with our fund raising, and I want to extend my sincere thanks to the many alumni who have contributed to their fraternity over the last year. We raised almost \$10,000 in 1999 from about 10 percent of our alumni, in part because Dan Greenberg '86 decided to improve our low alumni giving rate by offering a challenge grant that proved to be very successful. The house also received a substantial gift in memory of Richard Dole '28, and a plaque in his memory has been placed by the stairwell leaded windows to commemorate his generosity. Our undergraduate chapter continues to do well, but faces many challenges. Several fraternities have again been removed from campus in the last year. For our house, despite its incredible location and the new house improvements, it has become

increasingly difficult to fill the house due to the spring rush, the new alcohol policy, and low off-campus rents, but I am confident the undergraduates and alumni board will soon resolve this and any other problems that arise.

I want to thank each of you who came to Homecoming — the food was excellent, the company was great, the house looked awesome, the football team was victorious, and the weather was perfect! For those of you who couldn't make it, we missed you, but hope to see you for our Alumni Day Barbecue on May 20 (or at least at the next Homecoming on November 11)!
